Registration and Accommodation -

For both purposes, please use the enclosed form and read the instructions carefully.

Travel -

Everybody is responsible for making their own travel arrangements to the World Congress. The ISA Secretariat is not planning any activities in this area. However, in many countries the national associations are selecting a travel agency to organize charter and/or group flights. All participants should ask their national association for the name and address of the travel agency that has been selected for this purpose.

Travel Grants -

The Executive Committee of the ISA has set up a Travel Grants Committee with two tasks. One is to solicit grants and the other is to review applications for assistance from participants in the World Congress. With the modest funds available it will not be possible to assist more than a few participants, particularly from the poorer areas of the world. Since requests for assistance can be considered only from contributors, application forms for travel assistance are available only from the organizers of sessions.

Contributed Papers -

Individual scholars wishing to contribute papers are asked to send their proposals directly to the organizers of those sessions to which they wish to contribute. (The only exceptions are the four Plenary Sessions to which papers are contributed by invitation only.) The names and addresses of the session organizers are given in the program on the preceding pages of this Bulletin, insofar as they are available. Only in those cases where no names have yet been listed should potential contributors write directly to the ISA Secretariat; as soon as the address of an organizer is available, such materials will be forwarded. In all cases, only the organizers of the sessions will select contributions for their own session.

Copyrights -

Contributors to this program should be aware of the fact that the publication of the "Transactions of the World Congresses" has been discontinued; they have been replaced by a series of volumes entitled "Sage Studies in International Sociology". This means that not all contributions will be published by the ISA. The selection of papers and sessions to be actually published in this new series will be made by the Publications Committee in consultation with editors and the Editorial Board. Until such decisions have been made, the ISA reserves to itself the copyright on all

papers contributed to the Official Program. Authors will be informed as soon as decisions on publication have been taken; in the cases of papers that are not to be included in one of the SSIS volumes, the ISA relinquishes the copyright and the author is free to make other plans for publication.

Deadlines -

Here are some important dates for people who are planning to attend the World Congress and/or are participating in sessions.

Abstracts: As in the past, a booklet of abstracts will be distributed to all registrants. The forms for preparing the abstracts will be distributed by the session organizers to the participants in their session. In order to be included in the booklet, these forms will have to be returned to the ISA Secretariat before Feb. 28, 1978.

Program: Also as in the past, a program booklet will be distributed to all registrants. The information to be included will be provided by the session organizers to the ISA Secretariat. In order to be included, this information must be received by March 31, 1978.

Reproduction of Papers: Everybody agrees on the desirability of having copies of papers available at the Congress. Due to the increasing costs of providing this service, the Executive Committee had to make some hard decisions. Papers must be limited to ten (10) pages of single-spaced typing on 8 1/2 x 11" (or 21 1/2 x 28 cm). Only papers to be presented in sessions of the 'Official Program' (Plenary Sessions, Working Groups, and Symposia) can be reproduced beforehand for sale at the Congress. But in order to do this, one copy of each paper must be sent to the ISA Secretariat and another copy must be sent to SLAC (IX World Congress of Sociology, c/o RESO Congress Service, S-105 24 Stockholm, Sweden) by March 31, 1978.

Papers for all other sessions (Research Committees, Ad Hoc Groups, etc.) cannot be reproduced beforehand. Authors may make their own copies and send them to SLAC, or bring them along for distribution. However, these papers can be reproduced during the Congress on demand; but only if they conform to the above specifications and deadline.
