Du Secrétariat From the Secretariat

Depuis le 15 avril, un nouveau collègue travaille au Secrétariat. Grâce à un octroi de l'Agence canadienne pour le Développement international ainsi que de la Commission nationale de l'Unesco, Sergio Contreras Villa, du Chili, effectue un séjour d'un an chez nous comme stagiaire. Licencié en sociologie de l'Université Catholique de Santiago, ses recherches ont porté principalement sur le monde du travail et sur l'auto-gestion. Le but du stage est l'initiation au travail de l'AIS et l'acquisition d'informations diverses sur la sociologie mondiale susceptibles de profiter aux compatriotes du stagiaire à son retour au pays. Sergio est présentement attaché à rédiger un historique de nos 37 Comités de recherche. Le résultat de son travail sera acheminé aux responsables concernés pour correction et complément d'information, et publié par tranches dans le Bulletin à partir de l'automne prochain.

A new colleague works in the Secretariat since April 15th. Sergio Contreras Villa from Chile will stay with us for a year of training, thanks to grants from the Canadian International Development Agency and the Canadian National Commission for Unesco. Sergio has a "licence" in sociology from the Catholic University of Santiago and his research work has dealt mainly with the sociology of work and of self-management. The purpose of this period of training is to become familiar with those aspects of international sociology and the work of the ISA that are likely to be of interest to his colleagues when he returns to his country. At present, Sergio is busy compiling brief histories of our 37 Research Committees. The results of this work will be sent to the relevant persons in each Research Committee for correction and for additional information, and will be published in installments in this Bulletin beginning this fall.

Par ailleurs, la vie au Secrétariat est régulièrement ponctuée de visites internationales, toujours intéressantes pour nous. Durant les derniers mois, sont venus faire un tour chez nous: Paul-E. Humblet (Belgique), délégué au Conseil de l'AIS et hôte de la première réunion du présent Comité du programme; Francisco Parra-Luna (Espagne) qui s'occupe à organiser un groupe ad hoc sur la théorie des systèmes au Congrès mondial; Akinsola Akiwowo (Nigeria) de l'Exécutif, en route pour Los Angeles où il devait passer son année sabbatique; Mohamed Sayadi (Tunisie) qui a promis de faire connaître l'AIS auprès des collègues tunisiens; Issam El-Zal'm (Syrie) de retour de Cuba où avait lieu le Congrès de l'Association des économistes du Tiers-Monde, dont il est le Secrétaire exécutif adjoint; Szaba Mako (Hongrie) rencontré déjà à Budapest en août 1980, qui fait un séjour d'étude à Montréal.

In addition, the life of the Secretariat is regularly punctuated by international visits that are always interesting to us. During the past few months the following have been to see us: Paul-E. Humblet (Belgium) of the ISA Council who was the host of the first meeting of the current Program Committee; Francisco Parra-Luna (Spain) who is organizing an Ad Hoc group on systems theory for the World Congress; Akinsola Akiwowo (Nigeria) from our Executive Committee on his way to Los Angeles where he spent part of his sabbatical leave; Mohamed Sayadi (Tunisia) who was interested in bringing more information on the ISA to his Tunisian colleagues; Issam El-Zal'm (Syria) on his way back from Cuba where he attended the Congress of the Association of Third World Economists of which he is the deputy executive secretary; Szaba Mako (Hungary) who is spending a year's leave doing research and writing in Montreal.

D'autres rencontres, sans faire partie de la routine, relèvent cependant des affaires courantes, comme la visite de Gerardo Estrada (Mexique) dont nous parlons plus bas; celle de David Brooks (Grande-Bretagne), directeur de Sage; enfin celle de Jacques Došny (Canada) de l'Exécutif et Président du Comité de publications avec qui les contacts sont naturellement plus suivis. Est-il nécessaire d'ajouter que tous les membres de passage à Montréal sont les bienvenus à nos bureaux?

Other visits, though not exactly part of our regular routine, do deal with our current work, such as the visit by Gerardo Estrada (Mexico) of which more below; that of David Brooks (Great Britain) who is director of Sage and came to discuss our publications; and those of Jacques Došny (Canada) from our Executive and chair of the Publications Committee with whom contacts naturally are quite frequent. We hope that it is taken for granted that all members passing through Montreal are welcome and will be given the grand tour of the Secretariat.

Applications for Ad Hoc and SSO sessions were due on 30 June 1981.

Abstracts must be received in Montreal by 1 February 1982 at the latest. (This applies to plenaries, symposia, and research committee programs only.) Forms and instructions for submitting abstracts will be available from session organizers or from the ISA Secretariat after July 1981.

Final papers for all sessions, if they have been accepted by the session organizer, must be received by 31 March 1982 in the ISA Secretariat. Please note the style sheet that was published in ISA Bulletin 25, p. 3 and follow it to ensure that papers will be considered for early publication.

Session organizers of all sessions and coordinators of Research Committee sessions must submit complete program details by 31 March 1982 to the ISA Secretariat, if they wish to ensure that their sessions will be included in the World Congress Programme.

World Congress Registration: The forms prepared by the MLAC are available from the ISA Secretariat. 30 April 1982 is the deadline for the reduced pre-registration fees.

Hotel Reservations: Forms are also available from the ISA Secretariat. 10 May 1982 is the deadline for room reservations.

NOUVELLES DU MLAC

NEWS FROM MLAC

La composition du MLAC (Mexican Local Arrangements Committee) a été arrêtée par le Dr Octavio Rivero Serrano, recteur de l'UNAM (Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México). On se rappellera que l'UNAM est l'hôte du X Congrès mondial de sociologie qui se tiendra du 16 au 21 août 1982. Le MLAC est présidé par Julio Labastida Martin del Campo; le secrétaire en est Gerardo Estrada Redriguez. Les autres membres sont: Raul Béjar Navarro, Antonio Delhumeau Arrecillas, Sergio Rosas Romero, Francisco Casanova Alvarez, Rolando Martinez Muricio. L'adresse du MLAC est: Apartado Postal 20-333, Mexico 20, D.F., Mexico.

Dans un échange de lettres, le Dr Rivero et Ulf Himmelstrand, président de l'ISA, ont établi en mars les grandes lignes de ce qui sert de protocole d'entente entre l'UNAM et l'ISA. Par ailleurs, le MLAC et le Secrétariat sont demeurés en contact périodique dans le but de coordonner l'organisation du Congrès. Les 8 et 9 avril, nous avons rencontré à nos bureaux Gerardo Estrada, Secrétaire du MLAC, accompagné de son assistante Teresa Martinez. Les multiples aspects de l'organisation du Congrès ont été passés en revue et une division des tâches a été établie entre Montréal et Mexico. Par la suite, les 28 et 29 avril, Ralph Turner, président du Comité du programme et Kurt Jonassohn se sont rendus à Mexico pour d'autres réunions avec les responsables locaux. Ils ont visité les lieux futurs du Congrès, s'assurant que les espaces réservés accommoderont les nombreux congressistes et permettront la tenue de nombreuses sessions simultanées. Ils ont rencontré le recteur de l'UNAM ainsi que des représentants de diverses institutions intéressées à collaborer à l'organisation du Congrès. Leur impression est que la préparation du Congrès est en de bonnes mains et que les responsables s'apprêtent à passer la vitesse supérieure.

Sur le chemin du retour, Kurt Jonassohn s'est arrêté à Los Angeles et San Diego. A Los Angeles il a rencontré notre éditeur Sage avec lequel il a discuté la production et le coût des livres à paraître avant le Congrès ainsi que de l'exposition durant le Congrès. A San Diego, il a rencontré les responsables de Sociological Abstracts afin de négocier les modalités de préparation du recueil de résumés des communications, dont la distribution au Congrès a été décidée par le Comité exécutif.

In an exchange of letters between Dr. Rivero (rector of UNAM) and Ulf Himmelstrand (president of the ISA) they established last March the broad outlines of an agreement which will govern the relationship between UNAM and ISA concerning the World Congress. Moreover, the MLAC and the Secretariat are in periodic contact in order to coordinate the organization of the Congress. Then Gerardo Estrada visited Montreal together with his assistant Teresa Martinez at the beginning of April. We met with them for most of two days on April 8-9 in order to discuss in details the various aspects of organization and planning as well as the division of labour between Montreal and Mexico. Then, on 28-29 April, Ralph Turner and Kurt Jonassohn went to Mexico for further meetings. Site visits were made to three university buildings in order to assess the availability of space to accommodate the many simultaneous program sessions. They also attended a meeting with the rector of UNAM and a reception attended by representatives of various other institutions who are interested in cooperating in the preparations for the World Congress. They came away with the impression that the preparations are in good hands and are about to go into high gear during this last year before the Congress.

Kurt Jonassohn took the opportunity of this trip to make stop-overs in Los Angeles and San Diego. In Los Angeles he had a meeting with our publisher, Sage, to discuss production and costs of books to appear before the Congress as well as the book display. In San Diego, he met with Sociological Abstracts to negotiate the details of the abstracts book for the Congress that had been voted during the last meeting of the Executive Committee.

In this context, we repeat that the Research Committees were asked by the ISA Executive Committee to accept contributions from non-members of their committees provided that they are of high quality and relevant subject matter. Considering the number of sessions requested, these will be spread out from the 15 to the 21 of August 1982. Finally, we request that those responsible in each Research Committee send us as soon as possible any modifications and/or corrections of the present program.

Report of activities from the Research Committees (cont'd)

The reports below follow those that have been published in the previous issue. For the boards' officers and for the membership dues see Bulletin No. 25.

RC 01 ARMED FORCES AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION

The Research Committee had, to January 1981, 112 members and published a Newsletter.

It was constituted within the Research Committee a working group on international relations, as proposed by Professor Louis L. Kriesberg (Department of Sociology, Syracuse University). He will chair the group and will organize a session on Conflict Resolution as one of the topics of the Research Committee at the Xth World Congress in Mexico.

The Committee also cooperated with the XXth Anniversary National meeting of the Inter-University Seminar on Armed Forces and Society. This meeting was held in Chicago, October 23-25, 1980 and was built around two interrelated themes: "The Military Professional and Conflict Resolution" and "Civil-Military Relations in a World Perspective". Approximately 40 members of the Research Committee participated.

RC 03 COMMUNITY RESEARCH

The Research Committee is organizing a conference with the German Political Science Association in Düsseldorf. Several Research Committee members are planning to participate in the meeting, which will take place on October 1-3, 1981. Contact Terry N. Clark if you are in North America, otherwise Gerd-Michael Hellstern. The tentative topics include Urban Political Economy, Urban Social Movements and Neighborhood Revitalization, Urban Housing and Politics, and Urban Management and Evaluation Research. Papers that stress cross-national perspectives would be particularly welcome.

To January 1980, there were 71 paid members in the list of the Research Committee coming from: U.S.A. (48), Canada (7), The Netherlands (3), Finland (2), F.R.G. (1), Argentina (1), Australia (1), England (1), Spain (1), France (1), Norway (1), Scotland (1), Sweden (1), Switzerland (1), Yugoslavia (1).

In the last Newsletter of the Committee (Feb. 1981) the result of the last Board election was reported, as follows: President: Terry Nichols Clark (U.S.A.); Vice-Presidents: Peter Jambrek (Yugoslavia) and Jeanette Becquart-Leclercq (France); Secretary: Ken Newton (Scotland); Delegate to the Research Council: Donald B. Rosenthal (U.S.A.); Vice-delegate: Herman Turk (U.S.A.); Members of the Board: Roland Liebert (U.S.A.), Irwin Sanders (U.S.A.), Gerd-Michael Hellstern (GFR) and Barry Wellman (Canada); Current Research Officer: William J. Hanna (U.S.A.).

RC 05 ETHNIC, RACE AND MINORITY RELATIONS

The Research Committee membership list, dated through Spring of 1980, had 175 persons from 32 countries: U.S.A. (77), Canada (29), Australia (11), England (7), India (5), Israel (5), France (3), F.R.G. (3), Holland (3), Switzerland (3), Belgium (2), Italy (2), Finland (2), The Netherlands (2), Nigeria (2), Malaysia (2), South Africa (2), Gabon (1), Ghana (1), Ireland (1), North Ireland (1), New Zealand (1), Norway (1), Mexico (1), Philippines (1), Poland (1), Rhodesia (1), Rumania (1), Scotland (1), Sweden (1), USSR (1) and Wales (1).

In 1980, the Committee received a small grant (\$750) from the Secretariat to assist it in the publication of the Newsletter and to provide the members with the funds for more frequent and extensive publication and dissemination. In 1980-1981, the Research Committee plans to publish the newsletter twice yearly and to include additional information on Conferences, publications and other activities of interest to the members.

RC 10 PARTICIPATION, WORKERS' CONTROL AND SELF-MANAGEMENT

The third RC 10 workshop after the Uppsala Congress was held in Tokio, November 6-8, 1980. It was organized by Prof. Akihiro Ishikawa from Chuo University and devoted to the effects of unemployment upon Industrial Democracy; there were 15 participants from Japan and from other Asian countries, and other 13 participants from Europe and North America. Since the participants came from 16 different countries, the variety of experience was extremely rich. More than 20 papers were presented at the Workshop, and they will be published by Chuo University Press this year.

Two Newsletters were distributed to the members of the Research Committee during 1980. The number of members is steadily increasing and shows the figure 150 at the end of 1980.

At the same time we are establishing our own documentation center which will contain all publications of the members of the Research Committee, published after the Uppsala Congress.

The membership fee was introduced for the year 1981, since the Research Committee had been definitely established only the year before. The membership fee is US \$10 per year.

Before the Mexico Congress we are planning one more workshop. It will be devoted to participation in the public sector.

After the Tokio Workshop, the subcommittee for Asian countries and Oceania was established. Its main function will be to mobilize and coordinate the professional activity within this area.

RC 12 SOCIOLOGY OF LAW

The membership list, reported in 1980 to the Research Council of the I.S.A., included names of 191 persons, coming from: U.S.A. (45), England (23), Italy (21), F.R.G. (16), The Netherlands (9), Canada (8), Poland (8), Belgium (6), France (6), Japan (6), USSR (5), Denmark (4), Spain (4), Sweden (4), India (4), Brasil (3), Norway (2), Yugoslavia (2), Argentina (1), Austria (1), Australia (1), Ecuador (1), Finland (1), Hungary (1), Kenya (1), Ireland (1), North Ireland (1), Nigeria (1), Philippines (1), Portugal (1), South-Africa (1), Sri Lanka (1), Venezuela (1). That is 33 countries.

During 1980, there was a joint meeting with the Law and Society Association (U.S.A.), at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, June 5-8. It was based on 6 groups of 8 or 9 parallel panels, where approximately 186 papers were presented. The meeting was attended by sociologists of different countries.

In May 1980, J. Glastra Van Loon announced his resignation as president. This was accepted by the Board, at the Madison meeting. Vice-presidents Richard L. Abel and Colin M. Campbell are still on the Board, as well as Jean Van Houtte, Secretary.

A meeting of the Committee will be organized in Oxford (Sept. 24-27, 1981) in collaboration with the Center for Sociol-legal Studies (Wolfson College). Four workshops are on the program: 1) Law and Economy; 2) An interactionist analysis of legal processes (both civil and criminal); 3) Language use in legal settings; 4) Labor Law and Industrial Relations. Special sessions will be organized concerning research in progress.

A Newsletter should be edited once a year. Therefore the working group on documentation of the committee compose a report with bibliographies and information about meetings on sociology of law.

RC 13 SOCIOLOGY OF LEISURE

The Executive Secretary, Gilles Pronovost, announced last year that he will resign his position at the end of his mandate in 1982.

Two important meetings were held during 1980: (1) International Conference on Popular Culture, held at the Université du Québec à Trois-Rivières. Members of the Research Committee on Sociology of Communications, Knowledge and Culture, participated in the meeting. A selection of papers presented was edited in "Society and Leisure", Vol. IV, No. 1, Spring 1981. Two sub-committees of the Research Committee had an international seminar each. The sub-committee on the study of the social times had a precolloquium seminar where 4 papers were presented, and one more submitted. There was information on a french-polish project, and on a publication project. The sub-committee on leisure research and leisure policies also had a pre-colloquium seminar, and four papers were there presented. (2) The First Indian School of Leisure Research was held in India, at Waltair University, from September 5-25, 1980. About 20 university teachers, from different parts of the country, attended formal courses, lectures and seminars. The organizer was Prof. Y.C. Simhadri, head of the Department of Sociology, at Waltair University. Prof. G. Ghosh, Unesco Professor in social sciences (from Calcutta), acted as an advisor.

Two important proposed activities for 1981 were: (1) The organization of an International Symposium in June in Czechoslovakia on "The Way of Life and Leisure", organized by the sub-committee on way of life, chaired by Blanka Filipcova (Czechoslovakia); and (2) a meeting of the Research Committee on Leisure in Sao Paulo, Brazil, 15-18 September 1981. For the first time an international convention will be concerned exclusively with the issue of developing countries, and specially of Latin America.

RC 14 COMMUNICATION, KNOWLEDGE AND CULTURE

The Board and many members of the Committee took part in the World Congress of the International Association for Mass Communication Research IAMCR, during the last days of August 1980, in Caracas (Venezuela), on the theme "New Structures of International Communication? The Role of Research".

The Research Committee edited a book with papers of the International Confernece held at Barcelona in May 1978 - "Alternativas populares a las comunicaciones de masa", Centro de Investigaciones Sociologicas, Madrid 1979.

RC 15 SOCIOLOGY OF MEDICINE

In 1980 the Research Committee on Medical Sociology of the I.S.A. helped to organize and sponsor two conferences: one held in Boston (June 1980) and the other in Yokohama, Japan (August 1980).

The first conference on "Medical Sociology and Comparative Health Systems: A stocktaking", was sponsored by the Department of Sociology at Boston University, the Research Committee on Medical Sociology of the I.S.A., and the Northeast Program for Cross National Studies of Health Systems. Professors Mark G. Field (Boston University) and Derek G. Gill (University of Missouri-Columbia) were the two members of the Conference Organizing Committee.

In Yokohama took place the First Asian Seminar on Health and Medical Sociology. Chairperson of the Seminar was Mikio Yamamoto, M.D., D.M. Sc. People coming from many different countries attended to the Seminar: Canada, People's Republic of China, Denmark, Hong-Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, New Zealand, Philippines, Singapore, Switzerland, United States.

RC 21 SOCIOLOGY OF REGIONAL AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT

The cut-back of research funds in the United Kingdom, and the closing of the Centre for Environmental Studies (C.E.S.) in London, determined the change of Secretariat until Mexico Congress, to the University of Essex, where Michael Harloe is now working.

A successful conference was held last year at the Columbia University, attended mainly by American and European members. The theme of this meeting, which took place in May 1980, was "Economic Crisis and Urban Austerity". Manuel Castells and John Walton organized the conference and Peter Marcuse provided accomodation at the Columbia University. The Conference was based on working groups, focusing on housing, social services, urban austerity, urban social movements, sexism and urbanism, and public sector/local government.

One of the most successful groups studied the question of the new international patterns in the division of labor. The success of this group is reflected in the emphasis likely to be given to this topic at the next World Congress. Some of the papers delivered at the conference will be published in future issues of the International Journal of Urban and Regional Research (IJURR).

At the I.S.A. Research Council's meeting in Jablonna, at the end of August, the Research Committee on Regional and Urban Development submitted a paper by John Walton, which will be published in a collective volume edited by Sokolowska, Bottomore, Nowak, under the auspices of the Research Council itself.

A bi-national meeting was held at Lubljana in September 1980, on Urban Research. It was jointly sponsored by the Faculty of Journalism and Sociology of Lubljana, by the sociological section of the Polish Academy of Science and by the Research Committee. Directly organized by the vice-president Zdravko Mlinar, it was attended by more than fifty scholars from Poland and Yugoslavia, and a large number of papers were presented and discussed. The meeting was very successful and made a great contribution to the internationalisation of the scientific debate in both Poland and Yugoslavia. It was felt that both countries have different problems than the ones that are discussed with regards to Western World, but that many methodological, epistemological, general questions which characterise the western debate are becoming more and more important also for the Eastern European area. Publications:

- 1) Trend Report. Arrangements have now been made for the final stages in the compilation of the Committee's Trend Report and Bibliography. It is hoped that this will be published in Current Sociology in 1982.
- 2) International Journal of Urban & Regional Research. IJURR is now in its 5th year with an expanding circulation and subscribers in over fifty countries. A subscription to the Journal is the best way of keeping up with the developing work by members of the Committee and others working in our field. - 3) Cities, Class and Capital. This collection, edited for the Committee by Michael Harloe and Elizabeth Lebas, contains revised versions of some of the key papers presented to sessions of the Research Committee of the last World Congress. It will be published in late 1981. For further details, contact Sarah Cohen at the address given above.

RC 23 *SOCIOLOGY OF SCIENCE*

The bi-annual meeting of the Research Committee was organized in collaboration with PAREX and held in Deutschlandsberg near Graz, Austria, September 26-28, 1980. The conference has been generously supported by the Boltzmann-Gesellschaft of Austria and the Landesrat of Steiermark, Dr. Christoph Klausner. Johann Götschl (Universität Graz) was the local organizer.

A prior call for papers had elicited the sizable response of 37 papers. Of these only about one half were presented orally under five thematic headings: 1) Historical Studies: Social History of Science; 2) The Constructivist Approach to Science; 3) Theoretical and Methodological Issues in the Sociology of Science; 4) Science and its Socio-Political Context; 5) The Organization and Utilization of Research: National Perspectives.

All papers were made accessible to conference participants. Publication of the conference proceedings is not yet determined. Reviews of the conference have appeared in "4-S-Newsletter" and "PAREX Information", Spring 1981.

The founding of a European Association for the Study of Science and Technology, which is to succeed PAREX, was decided at the above-mentioned conference at Deutschlandsberg. The chairman of the Research Committee is also on the founding committee. Because of the obvious overlap of interests close cooperation will be kept with the future EASST.

RC 26 *SOCIOTECHNICS*

Among the major recent activities of the Committee are:

- the project to establish a research institute for sociotechnics (IRIS) and
- an initiative for the ISA Research Council to find out the potentialities of the ISA to provide social expertise.

The last issue of the Newsletter was edited in July 1980, at the Secretariat (KfUln, GFR). It contains a chapter of the last book written by Albert B. Cherns (Using the Social Sciences". London, Routledge & Kegan Paul Books Ltd., 1979), entitled: The Principles of Sociotechnical Design. There is also an article by Alexander J. Matejko and Sigvard Rubenowitz: "The Optimization of Socio-Technical Conditions"; and a report of Adam Podgorecki: "The Rise, Development and Downfall of the Institute of Social Prevention and Resocialization (I.P.S.R.) in Poland: 1972-1976".

RC 34 *SOCIOLOGY OF YOUTH*

CONTINUITIES IN STRUCTURAL INQUIRY

London and Beverly Hills, Sage Publications, 1981.

Studies of social structure can proceed from a variety of theoretical viewpoints - from the structuralism of Lévi-Strauss to that of British anthropology and Radcliffe-Brown. The papers in this book explore both the diversity and the underlying continuity of structural inquiry. Ino Rossi examines the theoretical premises of Lévi-Strauss's structuralism, Edmund Leach contrasts Lévi-Strauss with British anthropology, and Wolf Heydebrand discusses Marxist structuralism with special emphasis on Althusser. Maurice Zeitlin in his paper on Chile severely criticizes the world-system approach of Immanuel Wallerstein. S.N. Eisenstadt argues that Max Weber not only anticipated Lévi-Strauss's basic principle, but went considerably beyond it. Broader issues of conceptual analysis are also treated in papers by Charles Warriner, Walter L. Wallace and Charles Kadushin. Raymond Boudon discusses the paradoxical consequences of structures of social interdependence. Quantitative models of structural analysis based on empirical data are presented by Mayhew and Schollaert, J. Miller McPherson, and Ronald L. Breiger. A number of topics, then, from a variety of perspectives convey the great range of structural analysis. Peter Blau demonstrates in his introduction an aspect of their work that distinguishes structural analysis from other theoretical orientations, and the essays themselves epitomize the common strands that make structural inquiry a coherent perspective.
