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From the Editor

Dear Colleagues,

As 2008 concludes, the membership of RC04 can take satisfaction in a successful year. Our current membership now stands at 184, higher than it has been in several years. Our members participated in two very successful programs, one co-sponsored by RC04 and one in which RC04 played a significant role. In February, Vice-President for Europe, António Teodoro, and Afonso Celso Scocuglia of the Universidade Federal da Paraíba, Brazil organized a conference on "Education, Globalization and Citizenship: New Perspectives of Sociology of Education" in João Pessoa, Brazil. As reported in the July Newsletter, the conference was attended by more than 1,800 attendees, including more than 1,600 who served as participants. In September, RC04 members and officers participated in the "First ISA Forum of Sociology," held in Barcelona, Spain. Current RC04 council members and some former council members joined me in organizing the RC04 portion of the conference. The RC04 theme for the conference was "Accountability, Standards, Testing, and Inequality: Criticism, Collaboration, and Future Research." ISA reports that there were 2,549 registered participants drawn from 87 nations at the conference that included programs developed by 34 Research Committees and several Working Groups and Thematic Groups. RC04, one of the more active research committees in ISA, featured 93 papers delivered by 142 participants. A more detailed report on the Barcelona conference appears in this Newsletter. In addition to our two main conferences for 2008, Carlos Alberto Torres, our immediate past-president, served as the RC04 liaison to ICER (International Conference on Education Research) in Seoul, South Korea in October. RC04 was a co-sponsor of the conference and Professor Torres will continue to serve as a liaison to the organization to enhance collaboration with collegues in Korea specifically, and Asia in general.

The Newsletter continues the publication of Global Exchange, intended to promote not only information exchanges, but also to facilitate collaboration among colleagues, especially collaboration that crosses national boundaries. Members are asked to submit 100-150 word synopses of their ongoing or planned research in which member in-put, idea exchanges, and actual research collaboration are encouraged. It is hoped that members will submit descriptions of their research projects to be included in future issues of the Newsletter.

I am continuing to assemble a research interest directory that can be sent to journal editors looking for individuals to review books or manuscripts. This is likely to be most helpful to young colleagues who may not yet be known by journal editors, but it may be of help to all of our colleagues. If you are interested in being listed in this research interest directory please send me your contact information, including your name, affiliation and address, e-mail address, and a very brief statement of your areas of research and scholarship. From the President

Dear Colleagues,

The First ISA Forum of Sociology in Barcelona is over, but its materials and experiences are still under discussion. The theme of our Research Committee's programme was especially fruitful for international exchange of views and debate. As Gary Dworkin points out school accountability and increasing student testing have 'draconian consequences' for schools, teachers and students. It is vital to distribute presented research results and conclusions to wider audiences in the spirit of public sociology.

The theme of the pre-seminar of the congress was 'The Shape of Sociology'. The seminar was organized by the Vice-President Devorah Kalekin -Fishman and formed a starting point for on-going self-reflection in the framework of the ISA Research Council. One of the first concrete proposals based on the seminar discussion was included on the agenda of Research Council meeting in Barcelona. According to this proposal in coming congresses there will be a stronger representation of southern sociologists among the chairs of sessions in all research committees.

In my talk I emphasized openness and cooperation with the fields of sociology and also with the natural sciences and humanities in the context of the commodification of nature and the death or crisis of many languages and cultures. The current crisis of neoliberalism and the global warming call for a global sociology and macro theories again.

Our Research Committee is sponsoring the International Educational Conference in Seoul and our board is open to other suggestions for conferences in 2009. Preparations have also begun for the next world congress in July 2010 in Gothenburg on the theme 'Sociology on the Move'.

Research Project about Professional Ethics

The Research Project about Professional Ethics of the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM) is centered on: the construction of the theoretical framework; the construction of a state of knowledge about this theme in Mexico; interviews with professors of some Spanish universities; the design of an Attitude Scale and its application to graduate students in Spain and in the 40 graduate programs in UNAM. We applied the same instrument to a sample of professors in UNAM and organized the Interuniversity Project about Professional Ethics, with 14 other universities in Mexico. We have a strong research relation with Spanish professors, especially from Valencia and Murcia.

Report on the First ISA Forum of Sociology, Barcelona, Spain

RC04 had extensive representation at the First ISA Forum of Sociology that was held from 5-8 September 2008. Joining me as program chair were RC04 President Ari Antikainen and RC04 Vice-Presidents who served as session chairs: Jeanne Ballantine, Shaheeda Essack, David, Konstantinovskiy, Lawrence Saha, and António Teodoro. Additionally, former RC04 Presidents Jaap Dronkers and Abraham Yogev also served as session chairs. The theme for the eighteen RC04 sessions was "Accountability, Standards, Testing, and Inequality: Criticism, Collaboration, and Future Research." Copies of the Programme Book for all sessions, the Conference Abstracts, a listing of the participating countries, and photos taken at the ISA sessions are all available on-line at http://www.isa-sociology.org/barcelona 2008/index.htm.

ISA reports that there were 2.549 registered participants drawn from 87 nations who attended the conference. Programs were developed by 34 of the Rearch Committees and several Working Groups and Thematic Groups. RC04, one of the more active organizations, featured 93 papers delivered by 142 participants. Additionally, we co-sponsored three joint sessions on "Gender, Science, Technology, Innovation, and the Future," "The Role of University Research in the Future," and "Leisure Education in a Changing World."

In addition to the regular sessions, RC04 members participated in what was termed a "Common Session," meaning that different RC's joined together to address the same topic. RC04 participated in the session on "Sociological Perspectives on Democratic Renewals and Reforms." Vice-presidents Shaheeda Essack, Lawrence Saha, and António Teodoro joined me in presenting a paper that summarized central issues taken from the 93 RC04 papers, and entitled, "Accountability, Standards, and Testing in Education: The Fight for Justice, Human Rights and Democracy in Educational Access and Opportunity." Prior to the official start of the conference, ISA held a preconference seminar entitled "The Shape of Sociology," in which RC04 president Ari Antikainen discussed "problems to be resolved" (see the presidental message on page 3).

The conference was a stellar success. At the ISA executive meeting held at the Institut d'Estudis Catalans (Institute for Catalan Studies) on 9 September, participants thanked Arturo Rodríguez Morató, the general conference organizer and vice-president of the Research Council of ISA, for the quality of the conference. It is hoped that there will be a Second ISA Forum of Sociology that will be held sometime between the next two World Congresses—possibly in 2012.
