Brief Report on the RC 46 Interim conference, Johannesburg, South Africa, 28 June-1 July 2015

The Research Committee 46 interim conference was held in Johannesburg, South Africa from 28 June-1 July 2015; alongside the South African Sociological Association Annual Congress. The keynote address was delivered by Professor Margaret Abraham; President of the International Sociological Association. Her topic "Sociology Matters: Addressing Violence through Research and Activism" was a great lead in addressing the theme of the conference "Contours of Violence". It also demonstrated the importance of clinical sociology's focus on the need for interventions and action when addressing issues such as xenophobia, and violence against women. The Clinical Sociology group had the opportunity to listen to 20 different papers from academics located in South Africa, the USA, the Philippines and Norway. Professor Abraham attended a number of our sessions and expressed an interest in the work of the RC. We therefore invited her to become an honorary member of RC46. We would like to extend thanks to all of our presenters and chairs that helped make the conference a great success.

From Melodye Lehnerer, C.S.P.:

Information about certification

As a member of the RC46 Executive Board and a member of the Certification Committee of the Association for Applied and Clinical Sociology (AACS), I have received inquiries from RC46 members in regard to certification. These inquiries relate to discussions began at the World Congress Meetings in Yokohama (July 2014).

Designation: The Certified Sociological Practitioner (C.S.P.) designation is awarded by AACS to experienced professional sociological practitioners who demonstrate excellence in their practice of applied, clinical, or public sociology.

Process: Certification credentialing is a two-step process. First, applicants submit an application with supportive materials that include a curriculum vitae/resume, portfolio, letters of reference, and, college/university transcripts. A major part of this first step is documenting your academic and practice background and current practice. Second, if your application is approved you will then be given the opportunity to present your portfolio for peer review at an AACS meeting or another regional or national sociology meeting held in the U. S. For applicants unable to attend one of the meetings cited above, the use of video conferencing technology will be considered on a case-by-case basis. For

example, international applicants would be given this consideration. In all cases, the C.S.P. Credentialing Committee will make the final decision.

Eligibility: To be eligible for certification one must have a Master's or Doctoral degree in sociology. Those practicing sociologists with interdisciplinary degrees are also eligible if their practice features a strong sociological component. Applicants holding a Ph.D. must be able to document at least 1,500 hours or one year full-time working as a practicing sociologist in the last 5 years. Applicants holding a M.A. or M.S. must be able to document at least 3,000 hours or two years full time working as a practicing sociologist in the last 5.

Cost: The Certification Application Fee is \$200 U. S. and is due at the time of application. The Portfolio Demonstration Fee is \$100 U. S. and is due at least 2 weeks prior to the Portfolio Demonstration. Annual certification renewal is \$50 U. S.

Request: I close with a request. I would like feedback from the RC46 membership in regard to the process described above, especially those interested in certification. For example, I realize that members might prefer a designation of Certified Clinical Sociologist. This is an issue I can bring to the certification committee which meets October 7, 2015 in Montgomery, Alabama U.S. I would also like to raise the possibility of having certification demonstrations for successful applicants at the Third ISA Forum of Sociology in Vienna, Austria (July 2016).
