Dr. Rosemary Barberet is a professor at John Jay College of Criminal Justice, City University of New York, in the United States; a former member of the ISA's Executive Committee; and a representative of the ISA to the UN. She is a member of RCs 05, 29, 32 and 46. Rosemary just has been **elected by acclamation as member-at-large of the Executive Committee of the NGO Committee on the Status of Women, NY (or NGO CSW/NY)**. The NGO CSW/NY convenes global civil society for the annual UN Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) session in New York City and does global gender equality advocacy. The organization's main project is organizing the annual NGO CSW Forum during the CSW annual meeting. The NGO CSW/NY wants to bridge the gap between the official UN Commission on the Status of Women process in New York and global civil society as well as grassroots organizations.

ABSTRACT
 The UN Environment Program has identified plastic waste as one of the urgent challenges of the 21st Century and has set 2024 as the target date for the drafting of an international legally binding agreement on plastic pollution. While the concern for plastic pollution is justified, there is still no workable solution that considers the role that plastics play in society and the economy, and the scientific and technological problems that need to be solved. The functionality that is desired from plastics has led to the development of plastic composition that is complex, resulting in plastic waste that is difficult to recycle and uneconomic. The 3Rs have been a failure. A new system with two types of plastics is proposed: circular plastics that are functional yet easy to chemically recycle, and bio-based plastics that are designed for single-use and are biodegradable. This will require R&D into new plastics with the following characteristics: first, the plastics should have high functionality; second, they should be safe, both to humans and the environment; third, they should be based on abundant raw materials; and fourth, they should be economically viable. At the same time, the conversion of our current plastic waste into environmentally safe products must be undertaken. These initiatives will require a multi-sectoral approach that assigns responsibility to all sectors over a sustained period.
